

## DAY 16: DANIEL 12

### I. AT THAT TIME

- A. We know that these events have not yet happened because of the phrase, “at that time” (Daniel 12:1)
  - 1. We cannot separate the man from the events
  - 2. This is an eschatological chapter, not historical (Daniel 12)
- B. The angel, Michael, has been entrusted to be in charge of the Jewish people (v. 1)
- C. The Jewish people have not yet been delivered, we have not yet seen the resurrection of the dead (v. 1-2)
- D. The wise will be clear-headed in the midst of these End Times events, and will help others to understand
- E. Daniel’s last request is for more clarity on these events and the Lord tells him, “Go on your way” (v. 9)
  - 1. These events are not for Daniel to know
- F. In Daniel, we see 1,290 days, but in Revelation we see 1,260 days
  - 1. We can only speculate what will take place during these 30 days
  - 2. Could be that this gap is the time between Jesus’ triumphant entry to the setting up of his inauguration
    - a) It’s practical, these things can not be prepared over night
- G. We don’t have clarity on every detail, but those who wait and arrive to that day are blessed (v. 12)
  - 1. A time of preparing Jerusalem for celebration and feasting
